Feeding Difficulties in Children with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD)

This class is offered to parents and caregivers of children diagnosed with ASD.

Is your child having behavioral difficulties when you serve foods

that may not be a favorite? Does he'she like to eat only certain foods, gag and/or spit when eating certain textures? Is your child eating only pureed foods? Participants will learn and discuss the oral-motor, sensory and behavioral deficits in children with autism spectrum disorders which may be causing these mealtime challenges. Led by a Nicklaus Children's speechlanguage pathologist, this class will help parents and caregivers identify ways to improve diet at home and encourage positive attitudes towards eating. This eight-week group therapy program is designed for children

ages 7 to 17 who have difficulty managing anxiety. Participants will learn how to cope with fear and worry, identify anxiety triggers and learn about different ways to reduce anxiety and increase self-confidence. Parents are invited to participate in a portion of each session to learn how to reinforce coping techniques at home. Parents who are interested in this program for their child will need to attend an evaluation session with a therapist prior to the start of the program. Groups will meet once a week.
